All future graduates from September 1, 2022 onward will receive an Ontario Secondary School Diploma as a student of Rosedale Global High School. All graduates prior to September 1, 2022 have received an Ontario Secondary School Diploma as a student of Rosedale Academy. Rosedale Global High School is owned and operated by Rosedale International Education Inc., Canada's largest transnational secondary education provider.

Rosedale Global High School is an independent, Ontario-based Canadian private high school inspected by the Ontario Ministry of Education in Canada under Board School Identification (BSID) number 668726 and is authorized to grant the Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) to graduates of Rosedale Global High School. We employ Ontario Certified Teachers (OCT) from the Ontario College of Teachers to provide independent and centralized evaluation from Canada for our Ontario secondary school curriculum. In the 2022-2023 academic year, Rosedale Global High School provides learning to secondary education students in collaboration with 62 partners in 95 schools across 17 countries—and counting.

Alongside our partners, we advance the global education ecosystem to support students to develop the competencies and capacity they require to lead with empathy and cultural awareness, maintain diverse perspectives, and be responsive to the economic and societal challenges of a global society. Our vision is to create life-changing learning outcomes for students around the world through a transformative approach to learning. Together, we reshape the future of global education.

Upon successful completion of our program, students graduate with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (OSSD) issued by the Ontario Ministry of Education.

GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

To graduate with an Ontario Secondary School Diploma, each student must fulfil 30 total credits (18 compulsory, 12 optional), 40 hours of community involvement activities and the provincial literacy requirement:

PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT AND RECOGNITION (PLAR)

For students who are transferring from a school outside of Ontario, principals grant equivalency credits for placement purposes based on evaluation of the student's previous learning as directed by the Ontario Ministry of Education. Equivalency credits are granted to students who have appropriate transcripts and who have met similar curriculum expectations and standards of achievement as those who have taken the Ontario courses.
